The result of these negotiations, which passed through the hands of no less than three Secretaries of State for Foreign Affairs, was that Mr. Dyke, Queen s Advocate, on Thursday, 17th February, 1853, applied to Sir John Dodson, judge of the Prerogative Court, for delivery out of the registry of the will and codicils. He supported his application by a proxy of consent executed by the two surviving executors, Counts Montholon and Marchand, and by an affidavit by Lord John Russell, then Foreign Secretary, stating that the French Government had asked for the original will, and that Her Majesty s Government considered it advisable on grounds of public policy that the document should be delivered up.
