This book presents a comprehensive description of a specific subgroup of Latvian sound verbs, characterised by a certain formal pattern- a consonantal sequence typically consisting of plosive + sibilant + plosive, as in the verbs *kst* creak or *tark* rattle. The very number of these so-called noise verbs (Geräuschverben) makes it impossible to consider them a mere marginal phenomenon, though they belong undoubtedly to the expressive vocabulary of the Latvian language. The study is divided into different chapters corresponding to the levels of language phonology, morphonology, morphology, semantics and syntax exploring both source and nature of the characteristic consonantal sequence as well as the behaviour of noise verbs as full-fledged members of the verbal system, with special focus on the derivational possibilities and the correlation between noise verbs and onomatopoeic interjections. The semantic analysis does not only provide proof that noise verbs indeed denote primarily (albeit not exclusively) sound events of inanimate origin, moreover a detailed description of their particular semantics is given in contrast...



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
